- She has got two children.
- She's got two children.

→ It

- My house has a basement.
- It has got a basement.
- It's got a basement.

6.

→ We

- My husband and I have a great job.
- We have got a great job.
- We've got a great job.



7.

→ they

- My nephews have curly hair.
- They have got curly hair.
- They've got curly hair.

- She doesn't ^{have} ~~has~~ two children.
- She hasn't got two children.



5.

- It doesn't ^{have} ~~has~~ a basement.
- It hasn't got a basement.

- We haven't got a great job.
