NEGATIVE SENTENCES

- I'm not a teacher.
 - I'm not in the classroom.
 - You're not a secretary.
 - You aren't in the office.
 - He's not strong.
 - He isn't in the gym.
 - She's not my sister.
 - She isn't in my house.
 - It's not dirty.
 - It isn't in the garden.

- We're not doctors.
 - We aren't in the hospital.
 - You're not parents.
 - You aren't with your children.
 - They're not American.
 - They aren't in the U.S.

CONTRACTIONS

- * isn't
- * aren't

- Am I a teacher?
- you are in the office.
