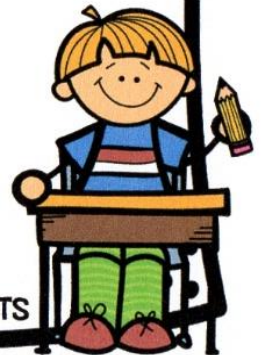

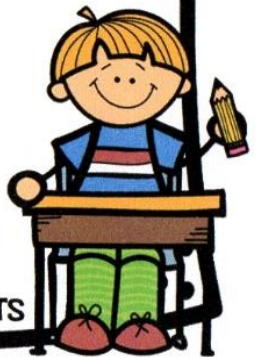


NEGATIVE SENTENCES

 - It isn't in the garden.
- We're not doctors.
 - We aren't in the hospital.
 - You're not parents.
 - You aren't with your children.
 - They're not American.
 - They aren't in the U.S.

• you are parents.

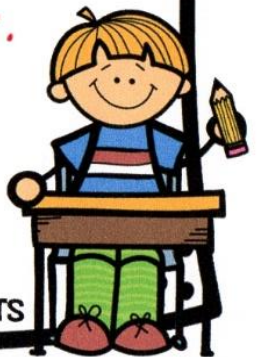
