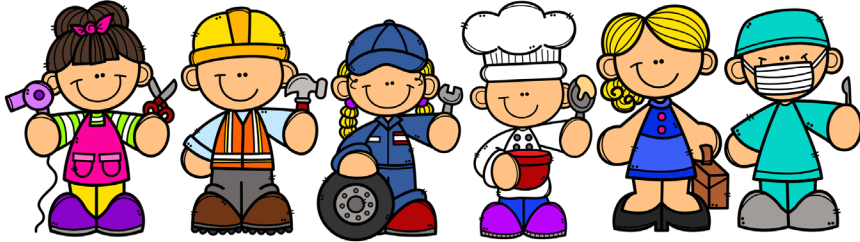


IRREGULAR VERBS

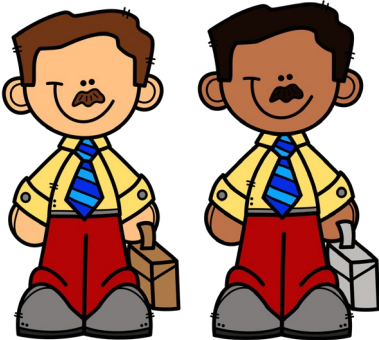


1. GO / WENT / GONE

- THEY HAVE **CAUGHT** SOME OF THE MOST WANTED FUGITIVES.

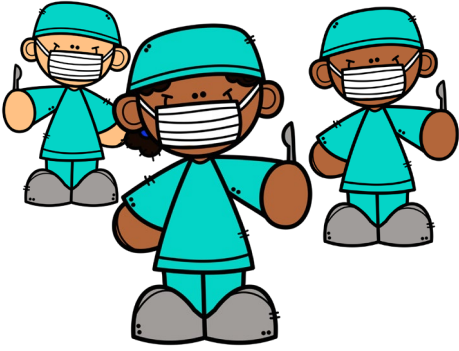
15. FIND / FOUND / FOUND

- HE HAS **MADE** FLOWER ARRANGEMENTS TO DECORATE WEDDINGS.

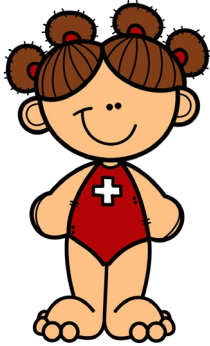


20. SELL / SOLD / SOLD



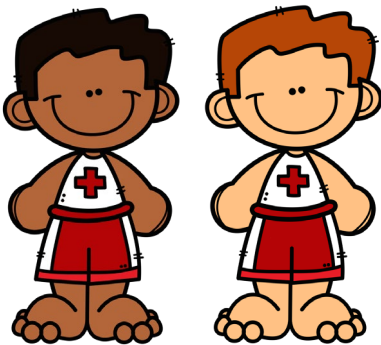
- WE EXPECT TO **SELL** 100 WREATHS FOR CHRISTMAS.

37. SWEAR / SWORE / SWORN



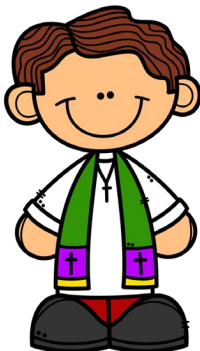
- TO BECOME A JUDGE, HE HAS TO **SWEAR** TO BE JUST.

- HE HASN'T **TOLD** US THE PARABLE OF THE PRODIGAL SON.

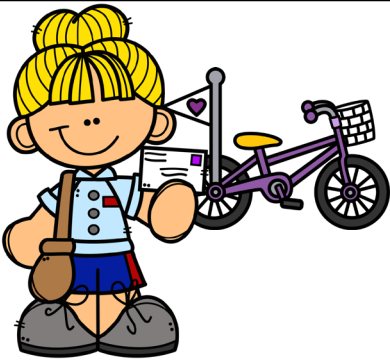


40. TEACH / TAUGHT / TAUGHT

41. RIDE / RODE / RIDDEN



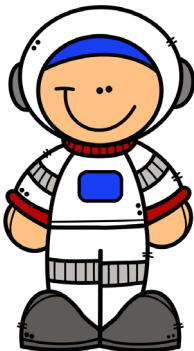
- I NEED TO **RIDE** MY BIKE SO I CAN DELIVER THE MAIL FASTER.

- THEY HAVEN'T **BROUGHT** YOUR POSTCARD YET.

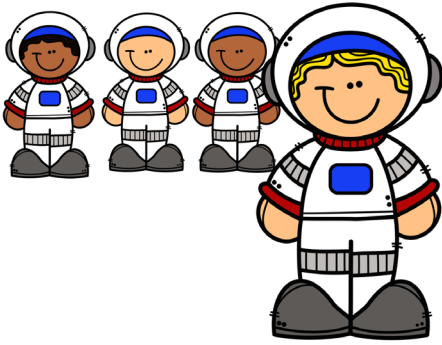
43. FLY / FLEW / FLOWN
