Is this Nicole's eye cream?

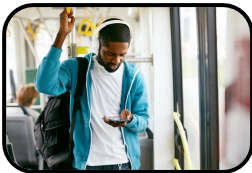
No. It isn't hers.

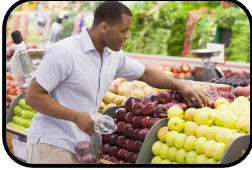
Part 3: Comparatives using "as... as..."

Tyler's boxes (**heavy**) Bryan's boxes.

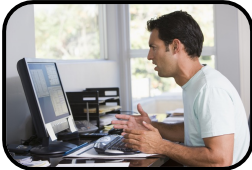
Tyler's boxes aren't as heavy as Bryan's boxes.
