

SIMPLE PRESENT - PART 2

Spelling Rules

Rule 1: For most verbs, simply add "S" to the base form.



1. James **walks** his dog in the park every morning.



2. Susan **texts** her boyfriend during her lunch break.



3. School **ends** at 3:00 PM, and then I go to soccer practice.



4. Claire **hugs** her son before bedtime.

Rule 2: When the verb ends in -S, -SS, -SH, -CH, -X, or -Z, add "ES".



5. The company **focuses** on eco-friendly practices.



6. Timmy **misses** his teddy bear when he's at school.



7. The little girl **washes** her hands before every meal.



8. The yoga instructor **teaches** meditation techniques.



9. The mechanic **fixes** cars at the local garage.



10. The bee **buzzes** around the garden.

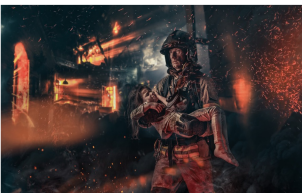
Rule 3: When the verb ends in a consonant + Y, change the Y to I and add "ES".



11. Mr. Johnson **worries** about his credit card debt.



12. The eagle **flies** high in the sky.



13. The firefighter **carries** people out of burning buildings.



14. The astronomer **studies** the stars and planets.

Rule 4: When the verb ends in a vowel + Y, simply add "S".



15. The cat **stays** inside when it's raining.



16. The dog **obeys** its owner's commands.



17. The couple **enjoys** long walks on weekends.



18. My family **buys** vegetables from the local market.

19. Mrs. Miller **has** a beautiful garden in her backyard.



20. The team **goes** to practice to prepare for the game.



21. Mr. Davis **does** an excellent job as the manager of the company.

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
